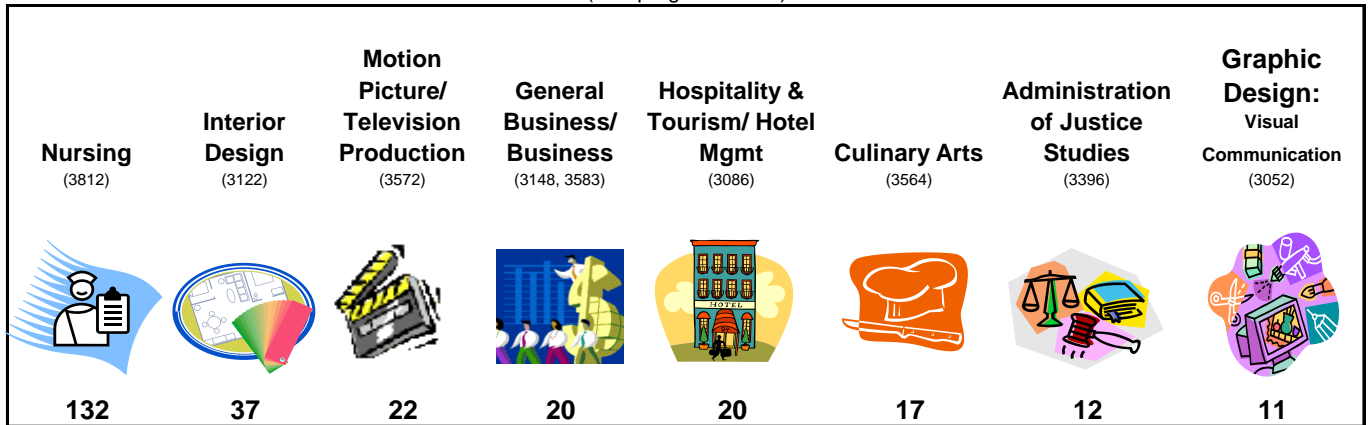

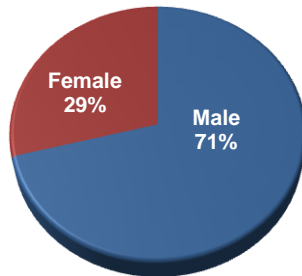

Fall and Spring Enrollment (Headcount) SCC and MCCC

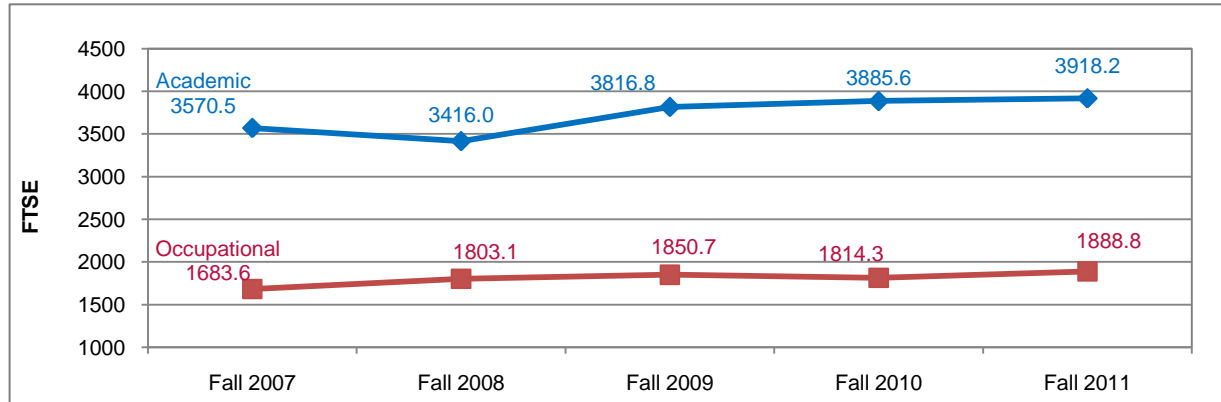


Fall and Spring Enrollment (FTSE) SCC and MCCCCD

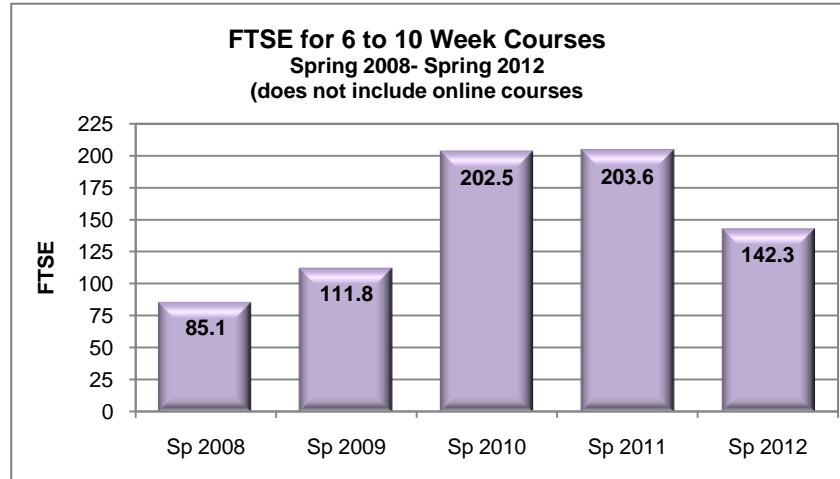
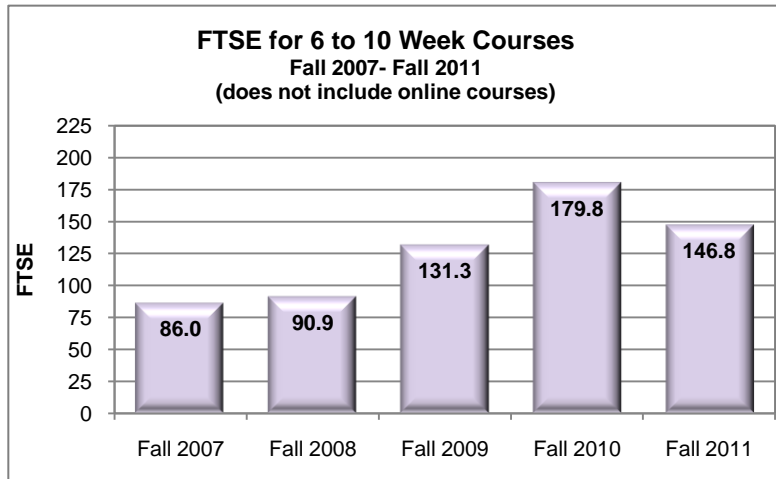

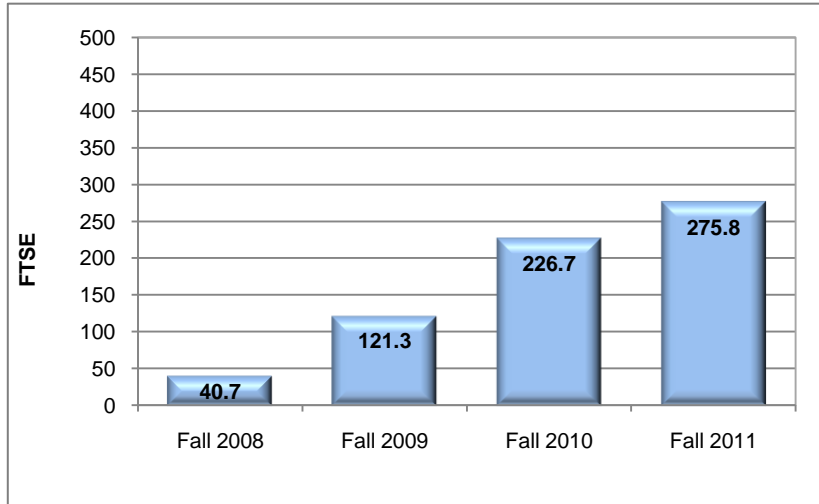


FTSE for Six to Ten Week Courses

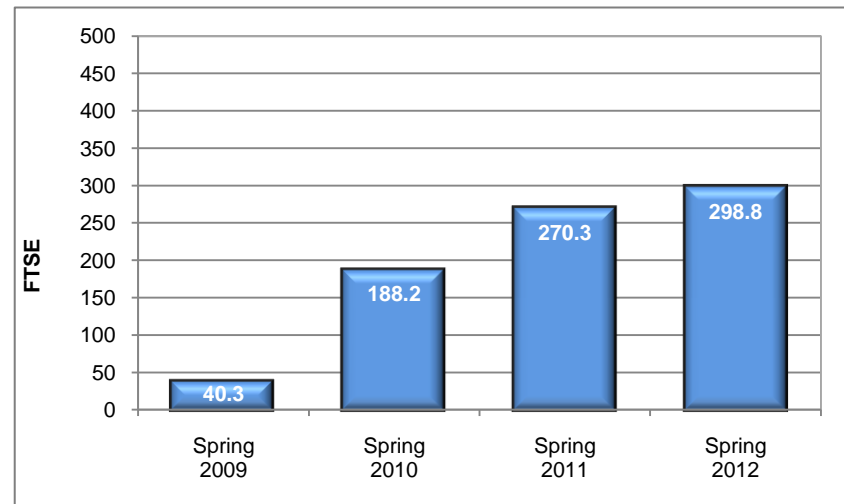


FTSE for Hybrid Courses

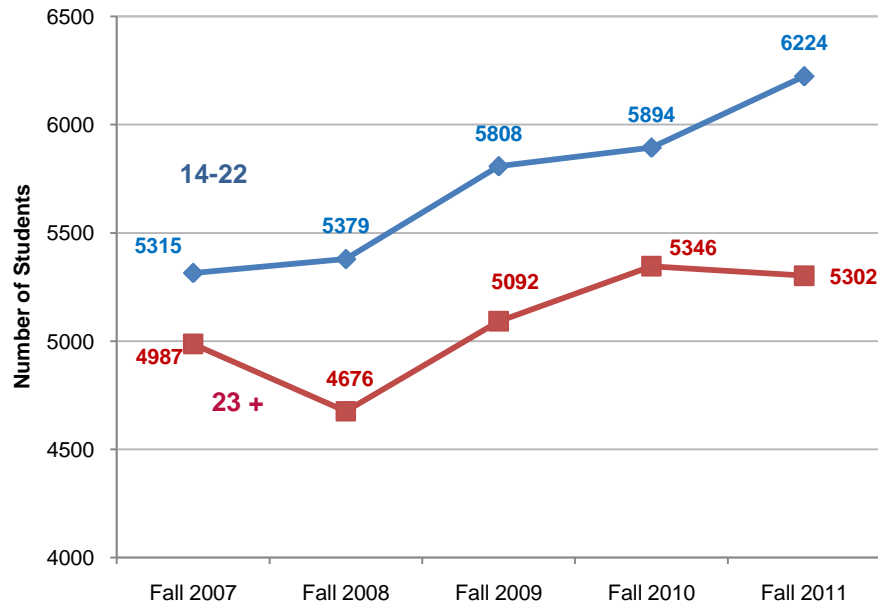

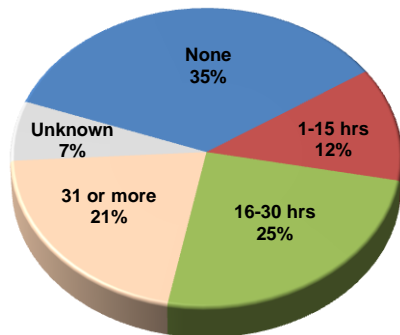


Students by Age Group



Number of Work Hours per Week

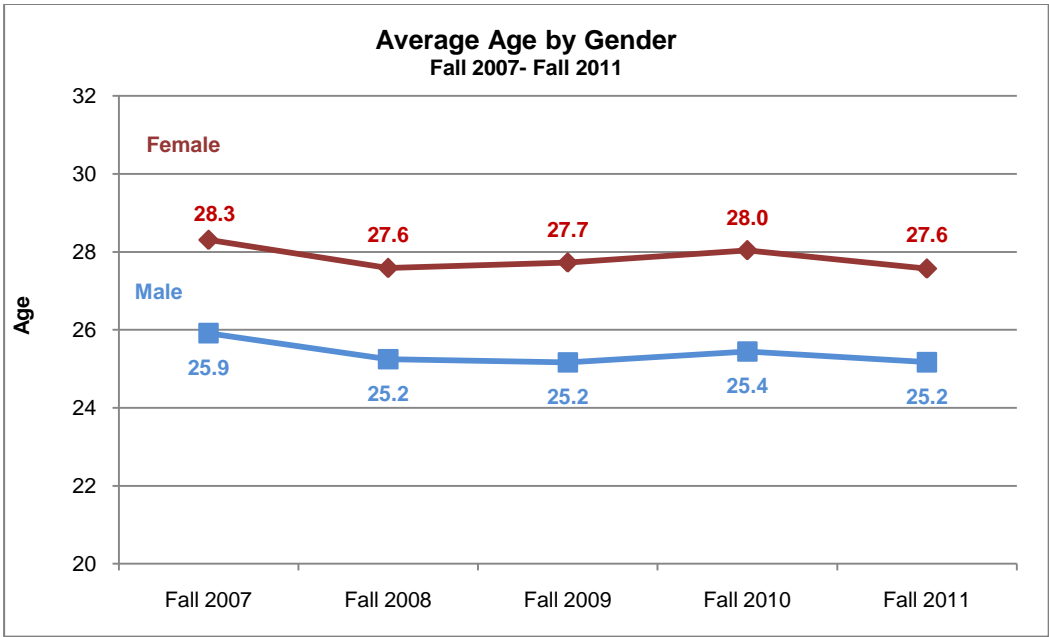

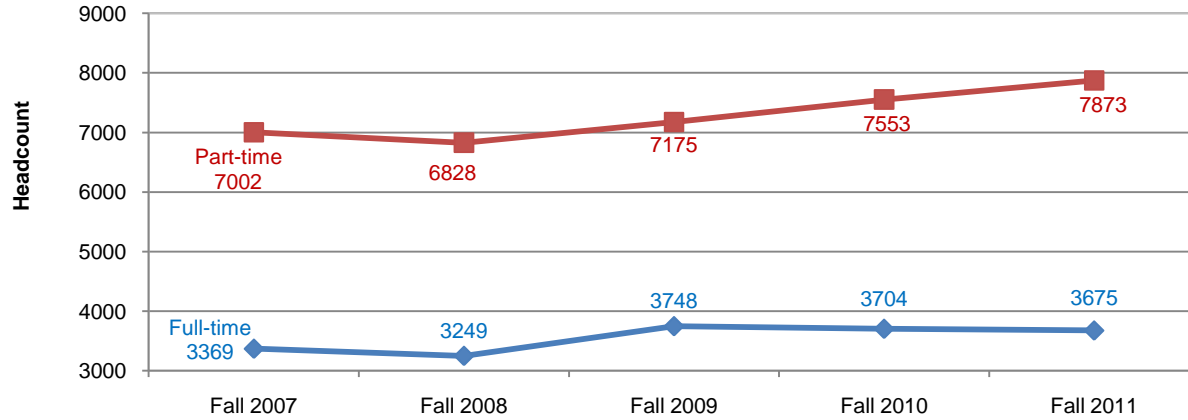

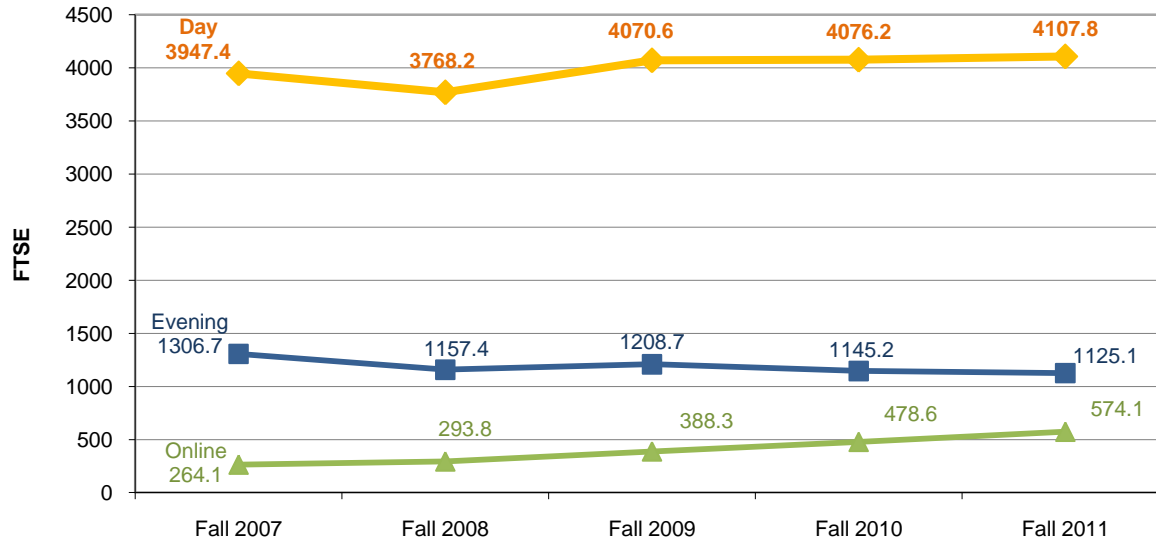

Successful Course Completion Rates by Instructional Mode

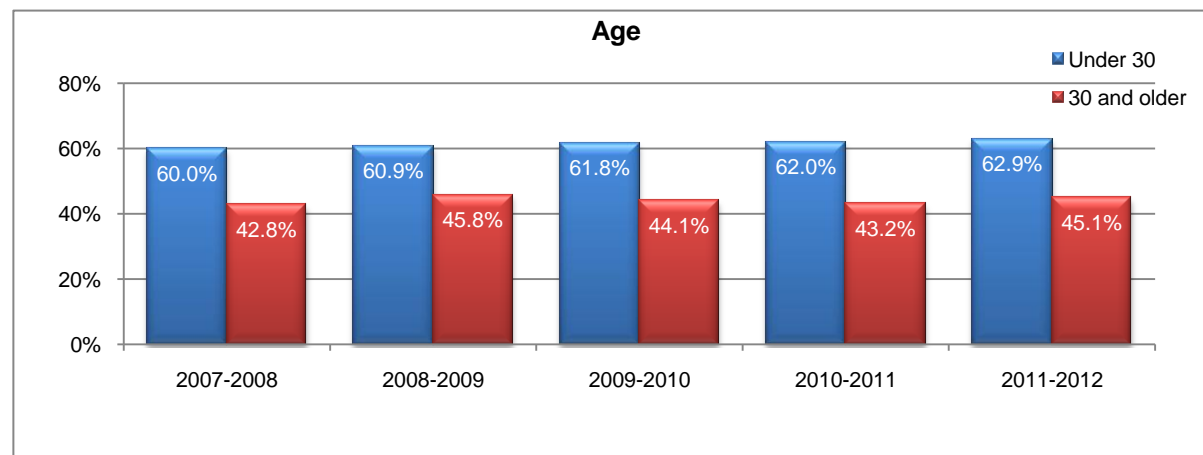
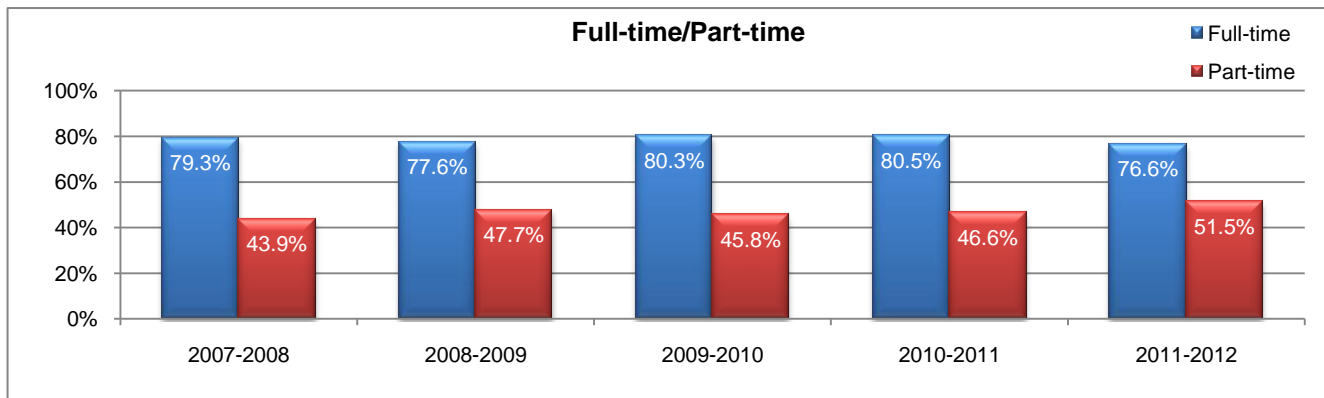
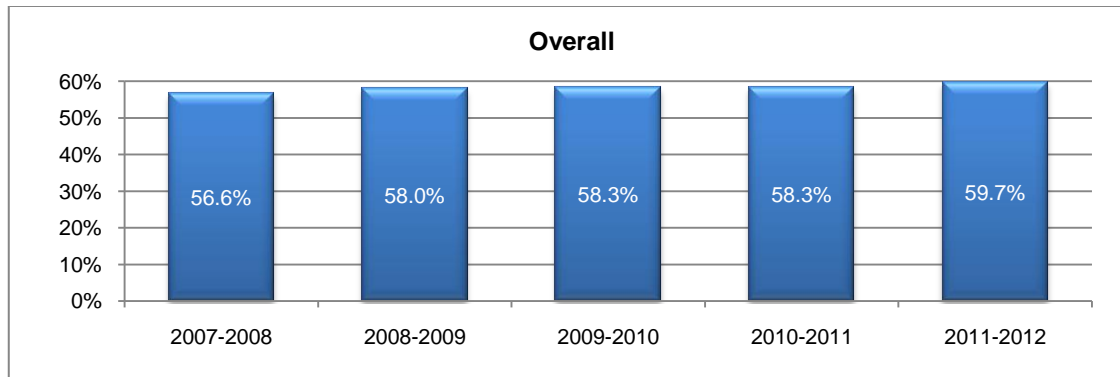

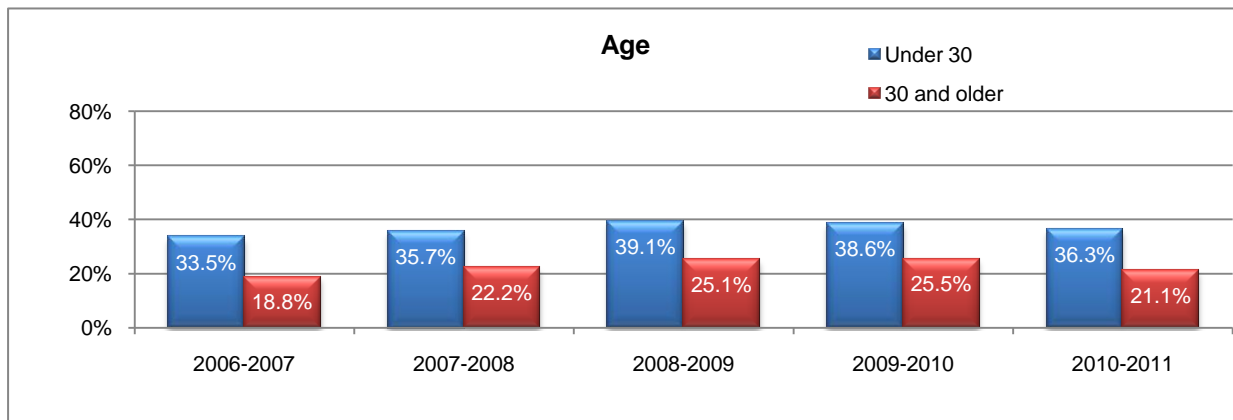
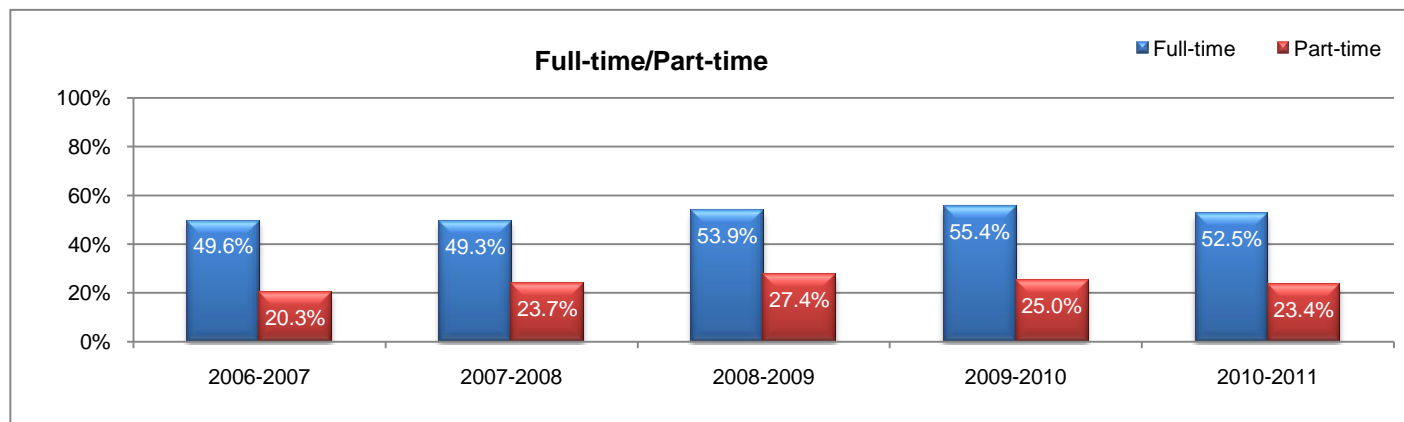
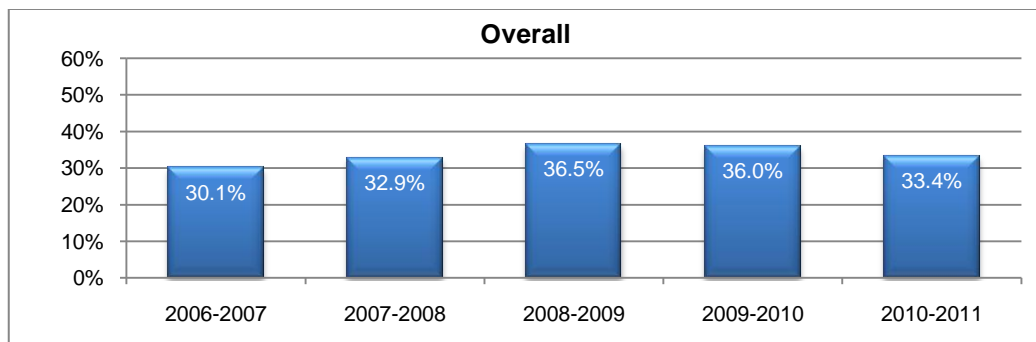
Fall to Spring New Student Persistence 2007-2008 to 2011-2012

Fall to Spring Persistence = New students enrolled at 45th Day in Fall who returned to SCC and were enrolled at 45th Day the next Spring term.

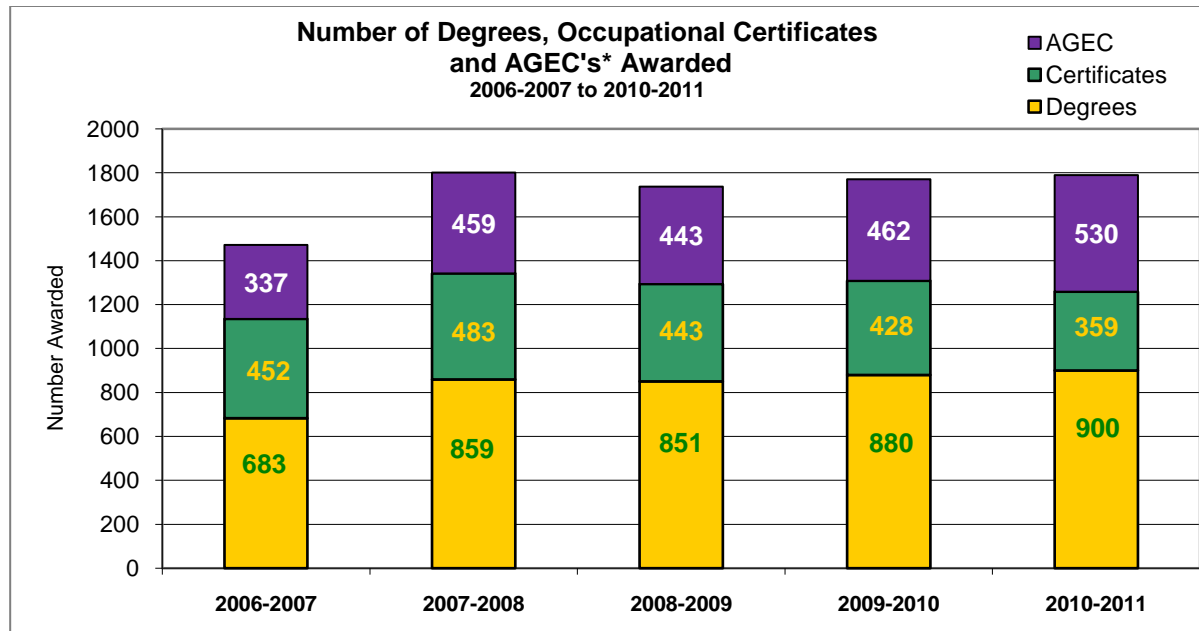


Fall to Fall New Student Persistence 2006-2007 to 2010-2011

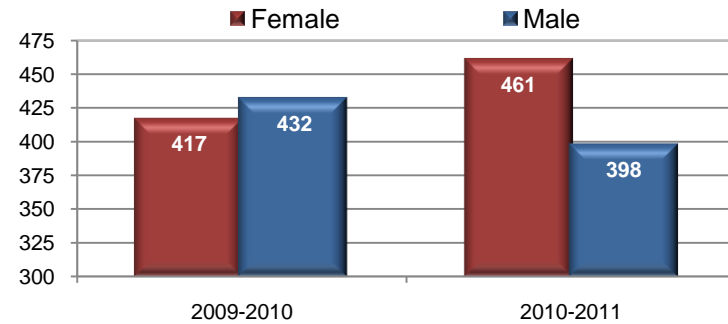

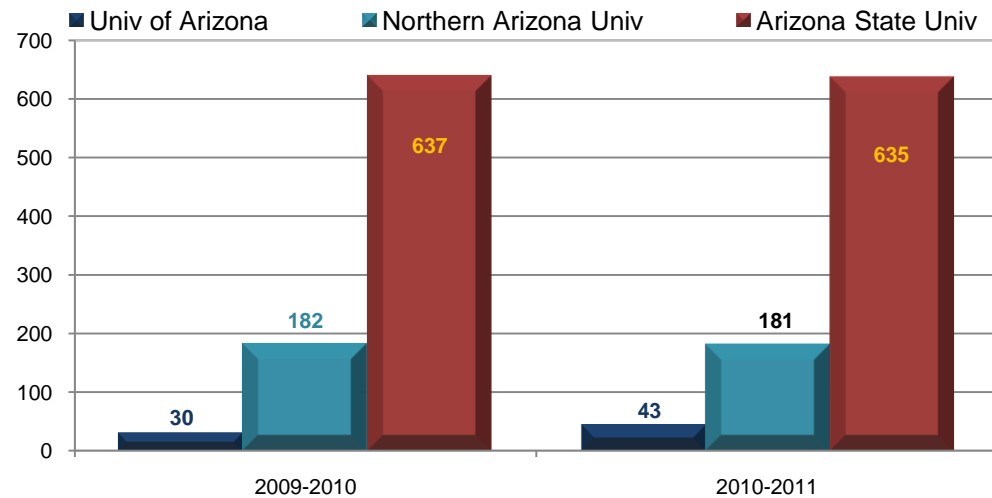

New Transfers by Gender



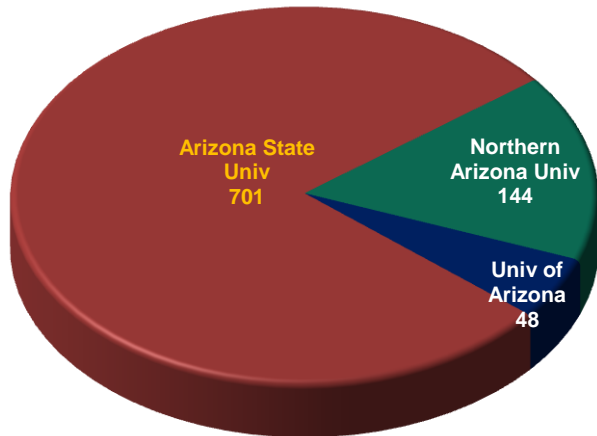
