
## THE CYCLE OF BECOMING

When I first began casting horoscopes in 1970, most people just interpreted sextiles and trines as "good," squares and oppositions as "bad," conjunctions as "maybe," and semisextiles and inconjuncts (quincunx) as "who knows?"


Dane Rudhyar was the first person I knew of who talked about aspects as parts of a larger cycle that begins and ends with the conjunction of two planets.

Thus, it was quite an eye-opener when I discovered his writings.


In particular, in his book "Astrological Aspects: A Process Oriented Approach" Rudhyar and his coauthor Leyla Rael identified the following stages of any cycle that he refers to as "phases of becoming" ...



Several years later, astrologer Michael Erlewine came up with his own description of the phases of a cycle which he labeled as (1) impulse, (2) planning, (3) embrace, (4) start, (5) embody, (6) extend, (7) experience, (8) know, (9) conserve, (10) detach, (11) trim, and (12) capsulate.



Likewise, I have my own version of this that I call the *cycle of becoming*, and I liken the stages of this cycle to the stages that people might experience in any relationship.



The *cycle of becoming* defines not only the stages of a relationship, but also the forms of expression (signs) and the activities (houses) that support each step of the journey. (\*The next two slides you can read on your own.)

Angle	Aspect	Meaning	House	Sign
0 degrees	Conjunction	The relationship begins. All is but a vision, a small seed, at this point.	House 1 - The focus is squarely on the beginning.	Aries - The first sign of the zodiac assists the relationship with its energy.

90 degrees	Waxing Square	This point is both stable and unstable at the same time. It is stable in the sense that this is a station along the way that things will pause at for a while. But it is also unstable in the sense that tension exists at this point. This is the point at which one will have to decide to either pursue deeper harmony or to severe the relationship completely. Will the relationship continue or will it end? That is the decision that must be made here.	House 4 - This house represents our personal environment, and within this environment we have to set up a hierarchy of what's important to notice and what isn't. If the relationship isn't going to continue, then its importance will be reduced to zero.	Cancer - This sign assists this phase of the relationship by being more sensitive to its surroundings than most of the other signs of the zodiac.
120 degrees	Waxing Trine	This is a point of maximum harmony in the relationship.	House 5 - This house facilitates harmony in the relationship by promoting pleasure, recreation, and personal creativity. It also maintains our perception of our personal environment by relieving stress. When we are overcome with stress, our ability to correctly perceive elements of our environment is impaired.	Leo - This sign puts the most focus on our self. How does this assist the harmony of the relationship? Because the closer we get to understanding who we really are, the more love and unity we will feel since our awareness is an undivided whole. By aligning with our real self, we are aligning with the source of our life and creativity.

In this house, personal karma is met,	Virgo - This sign assists with this phase of the relationship through its attention to minutia and the details of any situation. By striving for perfect order, Virgo sets the stage for the final flowering. Also, since Virgo is ruled by Mercury, this suggests that at this point the adjustments have to be made by the verbal, left hemisphere of the brain.



240 degrees	Waning Trine	At the waning trine the two are now one as they reside in great harmony.	House 9 - The ninth house traditionally rules religion, higher learning, and long distance traveling. These are all activities that expand our perspective. Also, the ninth house is the third from the seventh, and as such it represents the group mind or the mind of the other. This suggests that in order to have a strong relationship we must not only know ourselves, we must also deeply know the other person.	Sagittarius - This sign is ruled by Jupiter, and, thus, it is all about growth and expansion. It is also extroverted and feeling oriented, and its exuberance facilitates this phase of the relationship.
270 degrees	Waning Square	At the waning square, individuality reasserts itself one more time. Perhaps it is a midlife crisis. Perhaps the union was never meant to be afterall. However, if this last crisis is successfully traversed, then the union will be headed toward its final completion.	attention is being directed to other things, either the personal environment or the	Capricorn - This sign is an earth sign (introverted-thinking), and it is ruled by Saturn which seeks to control and regulate things. This personality type seeks to control the social environment as represented by the tenth house, and through control one can increase one's status. However, such inclinations towards control can also facilitate a crisis in the relationship.

300 degrees	Waning Sextile	The waning sextile is also a waxing trine when measured from the seventh house. This is a point at which midlife crises have been successfully manuevered, and the union is stronger than ever.	House 11 - Traditionally, this is the house of friends, hopes, and ambitions. It is actually a house that is associated with group activities and group creativity, and this also suggests that we can create great harmony in society if we only work together.	Aquarius - This sign is opposite Leo which is focused primarily on the self. Hence, as its opposite, Aquarius is focused more on the collective rather than the individual, and this focus on the collective fosters the sense of "we" that is now very strong in the relationship.
330 degrees	Waning Semisextile	The waning semisextile is the last station before the completion of the cycle. At this point everything is being left behind that does not conform to the perfect union. Every cycle we undergo is about learning something, and once the task is complete, the knowledge remains, but the vehicle can be jettisoned. House 12 is also the sixth as measured from House 7, and so it speaks to those minor adjustments that must be made in order to complete the original vision.	Pisces - This sign is ruled by Neptune which dissolves the boundaries that define many of our perceptions. This facilitates the withdrawal from action that occurs as the task is completed.

One of the things we learn from this cycle of becoming is that the stages of this cycle also define aspects, signs, and houses within a horoscope. Here are some other important lessons we can draw from this cycle.

The zodiac is defined by the phases of a cycle, and not by constellations. Furthermore, <u>every cycle</u> <u>defines its own zodiac</u>.

In particular, the 360° cycle of becoming is comprised of twelve subcycles of length 30° each.



We can replace each 30° sign with its own zodiac. In practice, there are two ways this is often done, and each way works in particular situations.

One way to do this is to begin each sign with a zodiac that starts at Aries and where each sign in this subcycle occupies  $2.5^{\circ} = \frac{30^{\circ}}{12}$ . I call this the *generic way* to superimpose a zodiac upon a cycle.

We could also add another subcycle to this by dividing each  $2.5^{\circ}$  segment into even smaller segments of length  $0.208\overline{3}^{\circ} = \frac{2.5^{\circ}}{12}$ .

## When we do so, we get something like the following ...


 $2.5^{\circ}$  cycle, Taurus  $32.7^{\circ}-32.9^{\circ}$  Fortunately, we can mathematically derive a simple formula that can be used for this. Under this scheme, the point in the zodiac that is most representative of each sign is located at  $360^{\circ} \left(\frac{n}{11}\right)$  where n represents the number of  $30^{\circ}$  segments that precede the start of the sign.

And here are the results for each sign. Interestingly, the quintessential point for Pisces is also the first point of Aries under this scheme.



However, another way to subdivide a sign into another zodiac is by using the dwadasama system of Vedic astrology. In this system, each dwad consists of 2.5°, and the first dwad of each sign begins another zodiac with that same sign. Thus, the first dwad of Aries represents Aries, the first dwad of Taurus represents Taurus, and so on. Using this *dwad* system, the point that is most representative of each sign is the beginning point of that sign.


Below is an illustration that shows that in the dwadasama system that the point that is the most Taurus is the starting point for that sign.




Likewise, the point that is most Gemini is 0 degrees Gemini, the point most Cancer is 0 degrees Cancer, and so on.



It may seem contradictory to have two different ways to impose a zodiac upon a cycle, but just like the image below can be seen as either a duck or a rabbit, so can different systems of astrology all be valid at the same time (in my opinion).



Thus, different zodiacs, different house systems, different coordinate systems, and different ways to subdivide an astrological sign into another zodiac can all be valid just as the image below is both a valid duck and a valid rabbit.



The bottom line, though, is that <u>every cycle defines a</u> <u>zodiac, and the end goal of every astrological aspect is</u> the oneness of that final union.



## **QUOTIENT STRUCTURES**

In mathematics we usually think of "union" as meaning to combine one collection with another, resulting in an even larger collection such as when we combine odd counting numbers with even counting numbers in order to get the collection of ALL counting numbers.

$$\{1,3,5,7,...\} \cup \{2,4,6,8,...\} = \{1,2,3,4,5,6,7,8,...\}$$

However, there exists another kind of union where the "two become one." This is the type of union between spouses that is described in the Bible.


Therefore a man shall leave his father and his mother and hold fast to his wife, and they shall become one flesh. (Genesis 2:24)

Therefore, a man shall leave his father and his mother and hold fast to his wife, and the two shall become one flesh. So they are no longer two but one flesh. (Matthew 19:5)

In mathematics we call this type of union (the "two become one" union) a quotient structure because we like to think of it in terms of some individual differences being divided or canceled out.

$$\frac{6}{2} = \frac{2 \cdot 3}{2} = \frac{2 \cdot 3}{2} = 3$$

For example, in mathematics we can turn a line segment into a circle by "dividing out" the difference between the endpoints. The circle can then be thought of as a "quotient" of the line segment



To give another example, we can think of the "forest" as the *quotient structure* that results when we no longer make any distinction between the "trees."





Any time that pieces of a puzzle come together, the end result is a *quotient structure* where we see the whole instead of the individual parts.





Similarly, when the pieces of some puzzle in our mind come together to form an epiphany or "aha" moment, we are mentally creating a quotient structure.



Likewise when "seat," "legs," and "back" come together to form a "chair," that chair can also be thought of as a "quotient" of its component parts.



Another way to think about quotient structures is in terms of boxes that things are tossed into. If everything goes into one and only one box, then when we are at the "box" level and are making no distinction between the contents of any given box, then we have formed another *quotient structure*.








We do this all of the time both in and out of astrology. For example, when we lump all people of a given sign together, we are forming a *quotient structure*.



In a similar way, if we make no distinction between the signs Aries, Cancer, Libra, and Capricorn, then we've created a particular quotient structure that within astrology is known simply as "cardinal."



← The quotient

The "pieces" are always the *component parts*, and the "whole" is always the *quotient*. For example a car is a whole or *quotient* that is comprised of hundreds of parts.




In summary, whenever the pieces of any puzzle come together or whenever we group things into categories, we are forming quotient structures, and quotient structures can be a unifying concept in astrology that can help us better understand many things.


There are lots of things in astrology that can be thought of as *quotient structures*, and below is a table illustrating some astrological pieces that come together to form quotients.


Remember that astrology is all about cycles, and the end game of every cycle is union. Furthermore, this isn't the "let's make a bigger collection" type of union. This is the "two become one" type of union.



We may be born with Jupiter square Neptune, but this is but one step toward a final goal of Jupiter conjunct Neptune.



Again in summary, astrology is a science of cycles, and the goal of every astrological cycle is to form a *quotient structure* that represents the blending of planetary meanings in that final conjunction. This goal is important to keep in mind.



## **HARMONIC CHARTS**

Harmonic astrology can be very deep, but the simplest application of a harmonic chart is to identify particular aspects by turning them into conjunctions in the appropriate *harmonic chart*. For example, a 2<sup>nd</sup> harmonic chart turns oppositions into conjunctions, a 3<sup>rd</sup> harmonic *chart* turns trines into conjunctions, a harmonic chart turns squares into conjunctions, and so on.

The calculations below show the relationship between specific angles and their *harmonics*.

Angle 
$$\rightarrow 180^{\circ} = \frac{360^{\circ}}{2} \leftarrow \text{Harmonic}$$

$$120^{\circ} = \frac{360^{\circ}}{3}$$

$$90^{\circ} = \frac{360^{\circ}}{4}$$

If *n* is a counting number like 1, 2, 3, and so on, then I call the angle  $\frac{360^{\circ}}{n}$  the root  $n^{th}$  harmonic.

To generate all the angles for a given *harmonic*, just keep adding the root *harmonic* angle to itself until you arrive via "clock arithmetic" back at  $0^{\circ}$ .






So now that we know what a *harmonic angle* is, how do we create a *harmonic chart* and what does this have to do with *quotient structures*?




To create, for example, a 2<sup>nd</sup> harmonic chart, we identify all points that are 180° apart with one another. For instance, consider the chart to the left that has North Node at 15° II and South Node at  $15^{\circ}$   $\nearrow$ .




If we identify all points that are 180° apart with one another, then we can fit everything into the first 180° of the chart (which is why I've erased the top half of the chart).




However, we very much prefer to work with charts that go from 0° to 360° instead of just 180°, and so we stretch things out by multiplying all our zodiac positions by 2. Furthermore, since our nodes are 75° from the start of Aries, they will be 150° from Aries in our final 2<sup>nd</sup> harmonic chart.




And here is the final result! As expected, both the North and the South Node are now conjunct and 150° away from the start of Aries, and 150° corresponds to 0° M.




A computational shortcut that works with all *harmonics* is to first represent each planetary position in terms of its absolute distance from 0° Aries, multiply by the harmonic, and then express the result as an angle from  $0^{\circ}$  to  $360^{\circ}$ .



We've already seen what happens when we do this for our original North Node. We get  $2(15^{\circ}\Pi) = 2(75^{\circ}) =$  $150^{\circ} = 0^{\circ}$  M. For the South Node we have  $2(15^{\circ} \nearrow) = 2(255^{\circ}) =$  $510^{\circ} = (510 - 360)^{\circ} =$  $150^{\circ} = 0^{\circ}$  M.




When we create a  $2^{nd}$ harmonic chart, it is a quotient structure because the difference between any two points that are 180° apart in the original chart is "divided" out. The "two become one."



And why is it important for someone like me to think of harmonic charts as quotient structures? Simply because there is a whole lot of previously developed mathematics surrounding this concept, and the more mathematics I can bring into my models, the more tools I have for achieving a deep understanding of what's going on!

And now let's get ready to look at a few harmonic charts. But first let me mention David Cochrane. He is one of the very top astrologers in the world, and he is the founder and CEO of Cosmic Patterns software that now sells both Sirius, Winstar, and other software packages for astrological research. He has a bachelor's degree in psychology and a masters in data analysis, and in my opinion he is the current **Sorcerer Supreme** when it comes to *harmonic charts*, midpoints, and evidence-based astrology. Also, his and my horoscopes look a lot alike.






In David Cochrane's free ebook on the first 32 harmonics, we find the following regarding the  $4^{th}$  harmonic.

"The 4th harmonic shows how we deal with stress, strain, and struggle (Marks). It indicates resistance and matter (Godefrey). It Indicates the basic challenges and things the person wishes to achieve, and that the person feels are important to become better at, rectify, or improve."


To this I would add the following point.

With all  $n^{th}$  harmonic charts we are creating a <u>quotient</u> <u>structure</u> in which, for the given value of n, all of the  $n^{th}$  harmonic angles are made equivalent to zero. Thus, in a  $4^{th}$  harmonic chart the angles of  $90^{\circ}$ ,  $180^{\circ}$ , and  $270^{\circ}$  are all made equivalent to  $0^{\circ}$  which, in turn, is the union that represents the end goal of the *cycle of becoming*.


Hence, if our natal chart has two planets that are square one another, then in the 4<sup>th</sup> harmonic chart this square will be turned into a conjunction. But that conjunction also represents the end of the cycle that those two planets are involved in. Thus, in my opinion, the 4<sup>th</sup> harmonic chart represents not so much what adversity lies ahead of us as it does who we will be once we have resolved the natal chart conflicts indicated by those natal 4<sup>th</sup> harmonic angles.




In my natal chart, for example, there are squares and oppositions between Pluto/Lunar Nodes and planets in Taurus, Uranus/Chiron, Uranus/Saturn, Saturn/Chiron, and Jupiter/Mars.




My 4<sup>th</sup> harmonic chart, however, shows the person that I'll become after learning the lessons presented by my natal squares and oppositions. Also, the conjunctions in the 4<sup>th</sup> harmonic chart are not exact because the aspects in the natal chart weren't exact either.




In my natal chart, I am more of a recluse  $(1^{st}$  and  $12^{th}$  house planets squared by ruler of the  $7^{th}$ ), but the  $4^{th}$  harmonic shows that as I resolve my issues with squares and oppositions, I become more sociable.




The person shown in this chart is more sociable (Libra rising), has found his personal power (Pluto conjunct Ascendant), is very expansive and outgoing (Sun in Sagittarius), but is also seen as deep with intense emotions (Moon in Scorpio).




The combination of Saturn, Uranus, and Chiron in Taurus shows that discipline, creativity, and a higher perspective are now operating in a persistent and coordinated way. In other words, I'm far more enlightened than I was at the beginning!




Sextiles and trines indicate allies while squares and oppositions show areas that might operate independently from one another rather than a full-blown conflict.



The deeper point, though, is that the 4<sup>th</sup> harmonic chart shows a different face or facet of ourselves that emeges once we learn how to transform those natal squares and oppositions into the final union that these cycles wish to achieve.




Also, when interpreting a harmonic chart, I tend to focus mainly on the highlights and to remember that the harmonic chart is just a modifier to the main, natal chart. Additionally, all the structure in the harmonic chart comes from the natal chart. We've divided out some structure (original squares/oppositions), but retained the rest.




For example, Uranus and Chiron are in opposition to the North Node in the 4<sup>th</sup> harmonic chart. Since we go from natal to the 4<sup>th</sup> harmonic by multiplying by 4, we can undo that by dividing by 4, and if we divide  $180^{\circ}$ by 4, we get  $45^{\circ}$ , the root  $8^{th}$  harmonic angle.


This means that our natal angles could be 45° plus, perhaps, some counting number multiple of 90°.




And sure enough, in my natal chart Chiron is semisquare (45°) North Node, and **Uranus** is sesquiquadrate  $(45^{\circ} + 1 \cdot 90^{\circ})$  North Node. Hence, one angle is 45° and the other is 45° plus a multiple of 90°.






I tend to only look at a few, but I consider the 12<sup>th</sup> harmonic to be very important because this is who you will be once you've learned the lessons of both your  $3^{rd}$  and  $4^{th}$ harmonics. This chart represents a far more complete version of yourself!




In the 12<sup>th</sup> harmonic I am more assertive (Sun in Aries), more expansive and pursuing knowledge (Sagittarius rising), and even more overtly mystical (Moon in Pisces). Also, my persona (Moon) and higher soul (Chiron/Uranus) function as allies to the Self (Sun).




Also, Pluto/Neptune in Scorpio indicates intense experience of absolute oneness while Chiron/Uranus in Leo suggests a satori like enlightenment of the true nature of the Self. Since they are square in the 12<sup>th</sup> harmonic, they tend to operate separately.



Remember, though, that all *harmonic* charts are quotient structures. What we are dividing out are specific angles like squares and trines in order to discover who we will be once we have, through life experience, brought those aspects to their final union.




However, since few of the aspects in our natal chart will be exact, another approach is to take the exact angle between two specific planets and create a quotient structure that converts that specific angle into a conjunction.




And when we do this, the resulting chart is called an *arc transform*.


# **ARC TRANSFORMS**




When trying to decide which arc transforms to look at, it helps to consider what planets are already working harmoniously together, what aspects are close, and which are tough.




For me that suggests looking at the *arc transform* of Mercury and Uranus, Uranus and Chiron, and Pluto and Ascendant.




My natal sextile between Mercury and Uranus makes me naturally creative in both mathematics and astrology, and in their arc transform, I have Mercury/Uranus in Capricorn near house 12. Thus, I am disciplined in my creativity, sometimes collaborate, but also work well alone.




My Mercury/Uranus arc transform self is more assertive and independent in its pursuits (Sun & Moon in Aries), and I am likely to receive acclaim for these endeavors (Jupiter conjunct Midheaven).




A grand trine shows how self, creativity, and intensity all reinforce one another (Mercury/Uranus/Sun /Pluto). Also, Aquarius rising, and Chiron in Aquarius show how creativity leads to universality and a higher perspective within me.




I did not begin using Chiron until last summer, but since the **Uranus/Chiron** opposition in my chart is a mere 3 minutes from exact, it is very strong, and I now realize how in my life Chiron has been present at every moment of deep spiritual growth.




In my *Uranus/Chiron* arc transform, their conjunction is in my 4<sup>th</sup> house. Thus, this transpersonal flash of enlightenment functions most strongly in my personal environment as I watch each perceptions disappear into the Oneness of the Self (Sun in Leo).




The opposition from Saturn suggests that I am still integrating discipline (Saturn) with this transcendent perspective (Chiron/Uranus). However, a square to Moon in Cancer suggests a nurturing persona that operates independently from the enlightenment of Chiron/Uranus.




The most difficult aspect in my natal chart is Pluto, ruler of the  $7^{th}$  house, in the  $4^{th}$  house square my Ascendant. Thus, neither home life nor relations with others were easy for me when I was younger.



The *Pluto/Ascendant arc* transform, however, shows me what I will be like once this cycle is brought back to union. In particular, I will have found my power in relationships (Pluto in Libra conjunct Ascendant). Also, strong personal creativity (Jupiter/Mars in Leo) and vision and imagination (Neptune in Gemini) are allies.



Additionally, in this face I am integrating my "enlightenment" with my persona (Moon opposite Uranus/Chiron), and an expansion of the awareness of self (Jupiter/Mars in Leo) is the focal point for this integration. There is also an intense focus on developing resources for relationships (Moon conjunct the nodal axis in houses 2 and 8).



But there are still some lessons left to learn in terms of curbing personal desires in order to attend to the needs of others (Saturn in house 7 in opposition to Venus in house 1 in Scorpio).


# **CONCLUSIONS**

In summary, the concept of a *quotient structure* leads us to a deeper understanding of the cycle of becoming, harmonic charts, and arc transform charts. Both harmonic and arc transform charts are the result of dividing out a particular angle in order to create the kinds of conjunctions and cycle completions that we are striving for. And each chart reveals an important face or facet of ourselves that we develop as we bring our various cycles to their completion.

It is important, though, to find yourself within each harmonic or arc transform chart that you look at, and if you cannot see yourself in any of those charts, then that suggests that the cycles whose unions are shown in these charts are still struggling for completion. For example, if you do not see a face of yourself in your  $4^{th}$ harmonic chart, then it is likely that you still have much work to do regarding the lessons presented to you by your natal squares and oppositions.

The cycle of becoming, harmonic charts, and arc transforms are all connected together by the single concept of a quotient structure, and hopefully, this presentation illustrates the power of a good mathematical model. Additionally, May the MATH (and
